INSTRUCTIONS FOLLOWING CERVICAL BIOPSY

- 1. You have just had a sample (biopsy) taken from your cervix. You will probably have some light bleeding for a day or two, and you may have some mild cramps for the rest of the day.*
- 2. If needed, ibuprofen (Advil, Nuprin, etc.) 400 mg (two tablets) every four hours should be strong enough for the cramps. If you should experience significant pain, please call our office.*
- 3. There should be no signs of infection such as fever, chills or foul discharge. If any of these develop over the next few days, please be sure to call our office.*
- 4. There should not be any heavy bleeding, and your menstrual cycle should not be any different. Please call our office for any abnormally heavy bleeding.*
- 5. Results will be available in about six days. Please call our office after six days to see if your results are available so that you can review them with your doctor.*
